Internet Service at a Lower Cost

Yadtel is partnering with Davie County
Schools and the Federal Communications
Commission to offer the Emergency
Broadband Benefit Program, established to
help lower the cost of high-speed internet for
eligible households during the COVID-19
pandemic.

Beginning May 12, 2021, households may apply for the benefit program. Households may receive a discount of **up to \$50 a month** for their internet bill.
